GENERAL RULES FOR SAFETY WHILE WAITING TO RIDE OUR TRAIN

1. Please do not place or throw anything onto the tracks (stones, sticks, pennies, etc.).
2. Please do not run anywhere on the museum grounds.
3. Please do not climb or descend any embankments.
4. Please do not walk on the track or the rock ballast next to the track.
5. Please do not climb trees, fences, structures or other trackside accessories.

WHO CAN RIDE OUR TRAIN

1. Due to the miniature nature of the 7-1/2" gauge railroad and the fact that passengers are not enclosed within the train while riding, some people may be asked to refrain from riding the train. Please do not ride the train if you are pregnant, have balance problems, are recovering from surgery, injury, or illness, or you weigh more than 250 pounds.
2. Children who cannot or will not sit still or follow directions should not ride the train.
3. Very young children, not yet walking, should not ride the train. Carrying a baby or very small child aboard the train is dangerous and not permitted.
4. The engineer and/or conductor are the final authority as to who may or may not ride on their train.

GENERAL RULES FOR RIDING OUR TRAIN

1. Passengers must remain seated, facing forward upright in the cars at all times. Turning around or reaching out from the car is strictly prohibited.
2. Passengers must keep arms and legs in close to their body while riding trains. Rocking the cars is strictly prohibited.
3. Passengers shall not use any type of cameras while riding on the train unless first receiving express permission from the engineer or conductor.
4. Children less than 5 years old must sit in front of an adult.
5. Passengers shall remain seated at all times and shall not get up from the car until directed to do so by the engineer or conductor.
6. If a passenger fails to comply with these rules, the train may be stopped and the passenger may be asked to walk back to the station.
